Business of the Librarian-Elect

The Librarian-Elect says that she would like to raise the issue of the Librarian's Office. She says that she has approached the Health, Safety, Fire and Clocks Officer but that it has not been pursued. She says that it has now become a genuine health issue.

The President asks the Librarian to remove all his personal effects from the office over the weekend to help with the clean up of this office.

The Librarian says that he thinks that someone has made this mess either to irritate or anger him. He says that there is absolutely no way that an upright bin is suddenly overturned in his office.

The President says that the trouble is that the doors are locked and coded and sees no incentive for him to tidy it.

The Librarian says that he will clean it.

The Librarian-Elect says that this is genuinely a health issue.

The President asks that those who may be responsible to help the Librarian.

The Treasurer-Elect says that this is ridiculous as it is not obvious who did this.

The Librarian-Elect responds that maybe there is some way that we can collectively clean this up.

The President says that he may organize a Standing Committee meeting on Friday 7th week for committee to clean up this mess.

The President asks the Librarian and Librarian-Elect to resolve this issue as this is their office and their personal responsibility.

The Librarian-Elect asks if there is any way of changing the codes.

The Librarian-Elect just wanted to bring to committee the general feeling about fines for not doing vacation days, as she currently disagrees with them.

The President says that when he finds a more effective means of ensuring committee work in the buildings for the required vac days. He says that he thinks that if you don't work 2/3 of your days then you are kicked off committee, but that there is no fool-proof plan that ensures this, without bias in one form or another. He says that if he looked at all the Standing Committee members, not many actually fulfilled their quota and if this was enforced, he would have been without a Standing Committee.

The Treasurer says that he feels simply that during this term, the Christmas vac is extremely difficult as there are only 36 days during the entire vac to work, not including Christmas and New Year. He says that he worked 24 days and there was realistically no more that he needed to do, even though eh was expected to work 30 days.

Mr Bhalla asks whether there is a case for withdrawing privileges from committee depending on how many vac days they fulfilled.

The President says that this is an extremely tricky issue and that if there is a way of making it more about what you have produced, then he would be happy to hear it.

Any Other Business

Mr Thomas says that he has business about the hosting of Jackie Stewart. He says that he understands that the Treasurer hosted Jackie Stewart and that Jackie made a comment that he was not suitably attired. Wants clarification.

The Treasurer says that he had a call 10 minutes before the event from Mr Freeland saying that the Librarian was not present and asked if he could please host him, which he then dropped everything and did. He said that he was not in a suit and asked whether this mattered, which he says that Mr Freeland informed him that the President had said that it did not.

Mr Freeland said that he just called him to summon him.

The President says that he thinks what Mr Thomas is trying to ask is why the Librarian was not hosting him.

Director of Strategy (Andrew Mason, University College), CWSC (Chris Adams, Brasenose College) and The Ex-Librarian (William Chamberlain, Lincoln College) re-enter the room.

Mr Thomas says he wants clarification.

The Librarian says that the simple answer was that he felt a little uncomfortable hosting a speaker that he had absolutely no input in bringing. He says therefore that he was not his speaker, and that he was confirmed by Rajiv Dattani (Secretary's Committee).

Mr Freeland says that he was working in the Librarian's office working under him.

The Librarian says to Mr Freeland not to tell him what he thinks happened.

The President tells the Librarian that he knows full well that in his position he is responsible for the speakers of the society. He says that he understands what he is saying, but that Rajiv is in Secretary's Committee, and cannot host. He says that also that Mr Rajiv Dattani was not the person that was delegated to host Jackie Stewart, but that it was Mr Ahluwalia, who was told that he was hosting him.

The Librarian says that this speaker was not confirmed while Mr Dattani was in his office. He says that in fact he went to...

The President interjects and says that he does not think it makes any difference.

The Librarian says that he apologise to the committee.

The President asks the Librarian to ensure that he does host the speakers in the future and that he is there.

Mr Thomas says that he thinks Mr Adams wants speaking rights.

The Bursar says that this has happened in the past and how embarrassing it is when she has been left with speakers when no-one turns up to host them. She says that they don't know the workings of the union and expect to be hosted by an officer and that she finds it quite distasteful when the staff and her are grubbing around for someone to look after them and that it is very bad manners and that it is the Union that suffers, not the individual.

The President says that he recommends to the Librarian ... (...can't hear tape...).. that he has the responsibility to host the speakers.

Mr Thomas says that he thinks that there should be some responsibility here and that he think that this committee should consider a motion of censure on this as he is actually quite embarrassed by this. He says that when you spend the time getting a speaker like Sir Jackie and then he comes here and then does not have a pleasant experience, that reverbations spread.

Mr Ahluwalia asks whether it is not acceptable for a member of Standing Committee to host.

The President says that it is not.

The Librarian-Elect says that is should go down in order of seniority.

The Treasurer asks whether it was reported that Sir Jackie Stewart did not have a good experience.

The President says that he thinks that Mr Thomas was referring to a comment made in his speech.

The Treasurer says that having been there he doesn't think that this was the case.

The President says that he certainly enjoyed the dinner and that he has written a letter and spoken on the phone and that he enjoyed it. (...can't hear tape...)

The President asks Mr Thomas what he would like to do.

Mr Thomas says that he thinks that there should be a sense of professionalism and he would like to propose a motion of censure on this. He would like to censure the Junior Librarian for his failure to take the appropriate action.

The Treasurer-Elect asks whether there can be a secret ballot on this.

The President says yes.

The President cedes chair to the President-Elect and leaves room at 18:32

The President-Elect asks if there is any other business.

The Librarian-Elect responds that we are still in the middle of something.

Ms Ernst asks what exactly a motion of censure is and whether it can be clarified.

The Treasurer asks whether we could clarify what a motion of censure is and asks the RO to do so.

President re-enters room 18:33 and re-gains the chair from the President-Elect.

The President asks where Mr Thomas was at, and asks the Treasurer whether he wanted to say something.

The Treasurer asks what a motion of censure actually is.

The President responds that he does not think that under the rules we have ever actually had a motion of censure.

Mr Thomas says that he would also propose a motion of no confidence.

The President asks what kind of motion of no confidence this would be. He suggests a motion condemning the actions of the Junior Librarian for not hosting his speakers put forward.

MOTION That this TSC condemns the actions of the Junior Librarian for not hosting his speakers.

Mr Ahluwalia asks what the procedure is if the person hosting can genuinely not host the speaker and asks then what happens what he says he seems to think has happened.

The President says that this is supposed to be between the Librarian and the (...can't hear tape...).

Mr Freeland says that the Treasurer was not going to host the speaker, he was just asked by the President.

The Librarian says to the Treasurer-Elect that if he wants to put forward motions of condemnation...

The President calls for order.

The President says to Mr Thomas that he wishes to put forward a motion of condemnation on the actions of the Librarian regarding Sir Jackie Stewart.

Mr Thomas says that this is correct.

The President asks whether there is a seconder. (The Treasurer-Elect raises his hand).

MOTION This TSC condemns the actions of the Librarian regarding the visit of Sir Jackie Stewart.

Proposed: Mr Thomas

Seconded: The Treasurer-Elect

The President asks whether there are any objections and if so why?

The Treasurer says that his objection to this is that he doesn't understand first of all the impact this is and how bad a punishment this is, saying that standing committee condemns the Librarian for...

(can't here tape)

The Treasurer says that he doesn't feel personally that he can judge how severe this is.

The President says that this is fine and says that this is an objection under the rules.

The President-Elect says that he wants to make a point that he thinks that the President will remember being on committee when similar sorts of motions and things ad hoc used to be put.

The President says that he does indeed remember.

The President-Elect says that he does not think that with lots of different view points and clashing of personalities on committee that whatever view you hold that it is particularly productive as a committee to take this approach.

The President asks committee to hold on one second. He says that Mr Thomas has put forward the motion and the the Treasurer-Elect has seconded it. He says that it has been asked for a secret ballot.

The Treasurer-Elect responds that he has.

(... can't hear speak...)

The President sedes the chair at 18:37 and leaves the room.

Mr Thomas says that he would like to clarify the actions which are not a personality issue at all.

The President-Elect says that he understands his point. He says that he does not think that this is productive. He wants to make it clear that you should come to your speaker meetings and he takes his point completely and that Mr Thomas is right to raise it but that it wouldn't be his approach for productivity for the committee by passing a motion of censure. He says he takes the point that people should turn up to their speaker meetings. He says that he would personally talk to them and that he wouldn't personally use this approach but that he is perfectly entitled to it.

The Librarian-Elect says that she agrees but that given that this is a one off and that this has not been happening frequently. She doesn't think that condemnation is necessarily a word to use. She says that he made a mistake and he apologized for this earlier in this meeting. She says she doesn't see what more we expect to gain out of this.

Mr Bhalla asks whether we can find out where the Librarian actually was.

The Librarian says that he was with his counsel in London and it was the only day that his council could see him for the upcoming SDC. He says that the RO will verify that this was 6 hours before the deadline. He says that the deadline was actually extended for him as there was no other time that he could do this. He says that he had actual barristers involved and that they are busy people and so he couldn't actually make it. He asks whether he should otherwise not do that and then get convicted for sexual harassment that would be a different thing.

Mr Freeland says that he thought that he said that he did not want to host a speaker because he did not feel comfortable and that now he is saying that he did not host a speaker because he was talking to lawyers.

The Librarian says that he thinks that you should get the due credit for your own actions and that it is a very, very sad thing...

Mr Freeland says that this is not the way that the society works.

The Librarian says that this is a very sad thing that that is the way that this society works. He says on a second note that had he been there for Sir Jackie Stewart if he wasn't in London then all that it would have taken would have been for James to say no, he can't host him and then he would have walked in and done it.

Mr Ahluwalia asks what happens if there are two speaker meetings at the same time.

Ms Ernst tells him to be quiet.

Ms Ernst asks whether the Librarian asked Mr Ahluwalia to ask him or whether he asked the President.

The Secretary says that she needs to go and get a charger for her laptop for accurate minutes.

The Secretary leaves the room at 18:39

Mr Thomas asks whether he can ask the Librarian whether he can clarify the situation. He says that the Librarian was in London all day and says that he is trying to understand how coming back to Oxford to host Sir Jackie Stewart factored into his plans. He asks whether he was unavoidably held up in London or whether...

The Librarian responds that yes, he just told him.

Mr Thomas says that even if he was in London, he doesn't specify why.

The President re-enters the room at 18:40

The Librarian tells Mr Thomas to be silent. He says that even if he wasn't then.... He asks committee to just do the secret ballot.

The Secretary re-enters the room at 18:40

The President asks the President-Elect whether he is chairing the meeting or letting it slip into a barrage of discussion.

The President-Elect says that committee was just chatting while the Secretary got her charger.

The Librarian asks the President-Elect for him to put this to a vote.

(The Secretary then proceeds to plug the laptop charger into the power socket)

The Librarian asks committee to also then pass a motion of condemnation to Stuart Cullen who had Phil Schroeder host a speaker, and himself host a speaker.

Mr Thomas says that that is not the remit of this committee.

The President-Elect says that this doesn't think that this is particularly productive.

The President says that people can make points if they want.

The President-Elect asks Mr Thomas if he has any more points.

Mr Thomas says that he appreciates that the President-Elect is just trying to chair this meeting and keep everything under control, but he says that we are also trying to establish the facts here of what happened in terms of why Sir Jackie Stewart was passed off to the Treasurer and he thinks that this discussion is also helping us elucidate these facts.

Mr Freeland says that he also wants to clarify why Mr Ahluwalia specifically was selected as the person on Standing Committee to host the speaker.

The Librarian responds that he is a friend of his.

Mr Freeland says that the Librarian therefore admits that it was personal.

Mr Ahluwalia says that he volunteered.

The Librarian says that Mr Ahluwalia volunteered and he therefore he allowed him to host the speaker.

Mr Freeland asks whether Mr Dattani would be a more suitable person to host him given that the Librarian said that he secured him.

(...can't hear tape...)

Mr Bhalla says that he thought that the issue was that Secretary's Committee could not host speakers.

Mr Ahluwalia asks whether the issue is that he is only hosted by the President or the Librarian.

The Librarian-Elect responds that he, however, did not know that.

The Treasurer-Elect says that there were more points and asks the Librarian why he was also sanctioned by Library Committee for not turning up twice and why he was 24 minutes late for turning up to host Tony Benn. He says that it is all the same thing and that it is just the Librarian not really doing his job properly.

The Librarian responds by saying 'what?'.

The RO says that if you have a complaint about the Librarian doing his job then Standing Committee is not necessarily the best time to do it.

The Treasurer-Elect says that the Librarian-Elect talks of this being a one-off event and that he's apologized for it. He says however that the fact that he was sanctioned by Library Committee as well adds another thing. He says that it is more of a general, it is not just the fact that he is being censured for not turning up to the speaker meeting but more of a general point.

The Librarian responds that if he was a third as competent as himself and got as many speakers as he got, of absolute excellent repute...

The Secretary points out that he is the Treasurer-Elect.

The Librarian responds that it would be the equivalent. He then says that he will not have the Treasurer-Elect question his competence. He asks if the Treasurer-Elect

knows how difficult it is in a Hilary vacation to get a speaker line-up like that, and then proceeds to call the Treasurer-Elect an 'idiot'.

The Treasurer-Elect thanks the Librarian for his comments.

The Librarian responds that he is welcome.

The President-Elect says that this meeting is going delightfully well. He says that it is descending into the ridiculous and that he doesn't think that it should censure the Librarian. He says that all he would like to do is make sure that everyone just takes a breather and calms down and that he doesn't think that this is really necessary.

The President re-enters the room at 18:43

The Senior Treasurer says that he does think that it is essential that this committee does not descend into abusing each other and that he thinks that the Librarian made unfortunate comments which, to call someone an idiot he doesn't think is correct, but he also gets the feeling that there is some huge animosity of one sort of another. He says that he thinks the way to resolve it is that there has been a motion put and that he thinks that this committee should vote on it. He says that it is a secret ballot and if it is thrown out there will be no censure or motion against the Librarian at all, but if there is a majority here, and he isn't sure whether it needs a straight majority, which he asks the RO.

The President responds that it is just a normal motion.

The Senior Treasurer suggests that it is put to the motion and that people should be allowed to vote.

The Treasurer says that the committee has moved to vote.

The Senior Treasurer asks whether this is possible.

The Treasurer says that TSC is waiting to get the ballot box.

The Senior Treasurer says that we have a box and that the RO will help.

The President interjects and says that apparently what TSC is trying to do is not allowed. He says that if you want to do it, then it must be done as dereliction of duty which is rule 71 a) i) i) and that he needs it in writing, as it has to go to an IDC, then it goes to an SDC, but this can't be done. He says that he has to leave as he has to host a speaker.

The President-Elect says that he now therefore takes any other business.

The President says that if you wish to make a complaint it has to be rule 71 a) i) something, as dereliction of duty on the grounds of not fulfilling his duties.

The RO informs TSC that it is rule 71 a) i) 12.

The President continues that if someone would like to do that then they need to put it in writing.
